Well in actual fact "A long time ago" was March 1989 and the "far away place" was Walesby Forest Scout Camp. A number of us from West Mercia Scout County were together for a weekend Campfire Leaders training course.

The weekend lived up to all expectations, and the group of us from the West Midlands evolved into the A-Team. (Why that name we'll never know?) Soon after, we decided to invest in sweatshirts;- red in colour, with a logo depicting the letter 'A' formed from burning logs. Each log had a number on it, reminding us of the strange custom of numbering timber prepared for a campfire, which was introduced to us on the training course.

Most of us found ourselves meeting regularly to run campfires at local campsites and over the county.

It was not long before we presented our first big, high-tech event, "A Million Flames". This was a spectacular combination of campfire songs, special effects, sketches, costume, pre-recorded and live rock music which took place twice to entertain over one and a half thousand scouts at "Camp in a million", Beaudesert in 1990.

A similar large scale event was produced to entertain Cub Scouts at "Jik Jok", though this time a circus theme was used.

FIRECRACKERS was soon in the planning, a show to take place indoors, roughly along the lines of a modern Gang Show. The first FIRECRACKERS took place in February 1992 here in Colton Hills School Theatre, Wolverhampton. Its success encouraged over one hundred people to volunteer to be involved in FIRECRACKERS 2 two years later. Between them, the shows have raised over five thousand pounds for our charity "The Goodwill Children's Village Society"

Continuing this theme, we are proud to present FIRECRACKERS 3. So please sit back and enjoy the show.

The Goodwill Children's Village



The Village is the creation of the Founder, John Foster, who, with his wife and two little boys, went to Thandigudi, 1700 metres up the Palni hills of Tamil Nadu, South India, to see what they could do for the poor. By sharing their hardships and respecting their customs, John became a trusted friend.

The Village helps girls and boys aged 7 and over, some orphans, others with one impoverished parent. The Village has never gone out looking for children. Children just come to The Village, some walking for

days to find it! In the 19 years since it began, Goodwill have painstakingly built a complex of 30 houses and 4 reservoirs. All the younger children go to local village schools and are keen to learn. Devoted house parents supervise homework and half of the children progress to High School, quite an exceptional achievement for hill children whose parents are often illiterate.

In the holidays many children return to their home villages so that family and community links are maintained.

At Goodwill the children are being helped to develop many skills valued in this rugged part of India. They learn about water conservation, hygiene, building and horticulture. Rabbits, chickens and cows are kept, and coffee, bananas and guavas are grown.

Support for The Village comes from schools, churches, clubs and individuals, most of whom contribute regularly, many sponsoring one of the ILAMS (happy homes) and receiving letters from children. £180 currently pays for all the material needs of a child in Goodwill for a whole year. 




